CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

What is Resurrection?

Christian faith is completely centered, and based on, the rising of Christ from the dead back to life, which is what we celebrate every Easter. It sounds relatively simple. That's what most of us have been raised to believe. However, the [theological] problem with that statement is that, if we look at the wording closely, it would appear that Jesus was simply 'resuscitated' back to the life he had before, rather than the Christ's resurrection into a fullness and abundance of life, which transcends what our human understanding can grasp. This is exactly the mystery that our faith attempts to bring us into: a contemplation of something that is life-giving, yet extremely difficult to understand. That's why we call it a "mystery of faith."

This "resurrection" is not limited to THE resurrection that took place 2000 years ago. The resurrection that Christ obtained for us is something that is cosmically ongoing, there is always something new to learn, to experience, and to be in awe of. This resurrection is neither limited to an individual nor a group of individuals, nor does it exclude those who do not believe the same way we do. As people of faith, the very essence of the Christ mystery moves us to embrace the totality of God's creation, other human beings, animals, and the planet itself. We are, after all, called to be 'stewards of creation.'

Having said all this, we are reminded occasionally that we are not perfect, and sometimes we fall short of what we are called to be. Living and working with other people is challenging at times, and we miss the opportunity to touch someone's life by being vessels of grace and cooperation. We, at this branch, are only too aware of this imperfect part of our personal and collective selves. Nevertheless, we are never alone, and we are constantly being called to mend our ways and our relationships with our loved ones, strangers, and our comrades. This seemingly simple act of reconciliation, reparation of broken relationships, and personal and collective accountability is precisely what it means to experience 'resurrection.' When we are able, and willing, to consider that our actions can have detrimental consequences to others, and when we consciously make efforts to repair broken relationships, a new, fuller, and abundant kind of life is born. In other words, "resurrection" can finally take place.

As we continue working towards our common goal, let us contemplate this greatest of mysteries, and let's be willing to risk being a little vulnerable, so that we can remove pride, jealousy, hatred, and all negative actions and emotions that prevent a resurrected life from flourishing. When we reach this point, we look at ourselves in a different way, and we are freer to become engaged in the branch's activities, we volunteer again and offer our services, for example, in committees, and other service initiatives, all with a renewed and life-giving impetus. Let us resurrect ourselves, and each other, so that we can be participants, and vessels, of the fullness and abundance of life we are called to have, and to be.






