

Memories of Vimy

History—why do I care?

I have a stake in the history of 100 years ago. You see my grandfather, Gordon Hamilton, fought in the battle of Vimy Ridge. During his participation on a charge he took a piece of shrapnel in his bottom and a bullet through his throat. He was removed from the battle field and evacuated to a hospital in England.

There he met a young lady who was his nurse. Her name was Lillian Tate. As his recuperation was over a long period of time they became boyfriend and girlfriend and eventually married. They had five children, one (Eileen Violet) was my mother who married John Steeples Harrison.

Both my parents served in the Canadian military. So, you see, if not for Vimy, I would not be here.



When we were at the Vimy Ridge ceremony at the bridge on April 9 questions came up on when to salute. Since many members are not veterans, things were unclear so Larry Harrison was asked what the rules are. The Legion follows the same rules that are prescribed in the Canadian Forces Manual of Drill and Ceremonial. Military and Legion members salute only if they are wearing the beret or other military headdress. If you feel the need to salute, and are not wearing headdress, you can place your right hand over your left heart. This rule applies at outdoor ceremonies like Remembrance Day and special ceremonies when the colours are paraded.
